

Pres. Rotary International To Visit Here

Rotarians representing 12 clubs in the county will hold a special meeting at the high school Monday noon, July 24, to honor Arthur Largueux, Rotary International president, who will make an appearance here.



The Caribou Rotary under president Chester Henderson, will be the host organization. Other club members will represent Presque Isle, Van Buren, Fort Fairfield, Limestone, Washburn, Houlton, Madawaska, Grand Falls and Edmundston, N. B., and Ashland and Fort Kent.

The visit here by Largueux will be the first time a Rotary International president has ever stopped off in Caribou during his regular tour of clubs, it was reported. Following the meeting on Monday noon, Largueux will leave for an appearance at Fredericton in the evening.

Largueux is president of an investment corporation in Quebec City, Canada. He was born at Tring Junction, Quebec, and was educated at St. Anne-de-la-Pocatiere College (Quebec) and at St. Anne's Academy in New York City.

He is Rotary International president for 1950-51. He has been a member of the Rotary club of Quebec since 1934, is a past president of that club, and has served Rotary International as director, district governor, and as committee chairman and member.

He is president of the La Sarre Power Company in Quebec, and of the Financial Building in Quebec City. He is director of the Commonwealth International Corporation and of the Leverage Fund of Canada, Ltd. In Quebec City he is chairman of the Re-establishment Credit Advisory Committee of the Canadian Department of Veterans Affairs and is an Officer of the Order of the British Empire.
