

Rotary International President Will Be Greeted Tomorrow

Rotarians from Amherst, Sackville, Springhill and Port Elgin will gather here tomorrow to welcome Arthur Lagueux, Quebec City, president of Rotary International. Details of the special program were released today by Amherst officials who stated that the president was expected in Amherst shortly before noon.

He will be officially met at the Nova Scotia Information Bureau at 11:45 a.m. and will motor to Amherst. The Canadian Legion band will meet the motorcade at the junction of Lawrence and Victoria Streets and will march to the Fort Cumberland Hotel.

A civic welcome will be extended to the distinguished visitor by Mayor F. C. Wightman in the Hotel at 12 noon.

The ladies will meet Mrs. Lagueux at 12.30 and luncheon will be served in the hotel dining room at 1.00 p.m.

N. T. Avard of Amherst will introduce the president and C. F. Johns, president of the Sackville Club will thank the speaker following his address. Ralph Zink, president of the Amherst Rotary club will preside as chairman.

The visit will mark the first occasion in the history of the Sackville and Amherst Rotary Club that they have entertained a president of the world-wide organization.

Special decorations have been placed on the Fort Cumberland Hotel while a huge welcome arch is being erected on Lawrence Street today. The business section of the town will also be decorated for the occasion.

President Lagueux is scheduled to leave for Truro at 3 p.m.

Rotary President To Visit Amherst
