

Rotary Ideals Topic Of Address

Rotary ideals of doing something for somebody else, with profit as a mere by-product, applied universally to the world in general, would certainly alleviate many problems current today in the opinion of Arthur Lagueux of Quebec, President of Rotary International, who addressed the Halifax Rotary Club at the Nova Scotian Hotel yesterday.

He said that service was the cardinal objective of Rotary and profit was a mere incidental "a material by-product of a spiritual ideal."

He said that idealistic thinking was wasted unless it is harnessed and added that "if the world is to improve we must take steps to put idealism into action."

His visit here marks the first time that an International Rotary President has arrived here in an official capacity. He was welcomed by Premier Angus L. Macdonald who was a special guest at the meeting.
