

Reservations Pour In for Visit of Rotary President

E. T. Kipf, chairman of the program committee for the visit of the Rotary International president here Monday, said today plans for the occasion are rapidly being completed and that more than 500 reservations from Southland Rotarians have been received.

Arthur Lagueux, of Quebec City, Canada, is president of Rotary International, and will make Brawley his only official Southland stop in a tour of Rotary clubs.

His visit is expected to attract more than 1000 Rotarians for a program in the Plaza Monday evening and an address by Lagueux Monday night at Palmer auditorium.

Kipf said the Plaza program will include music by Mariaches, a cowboy band, a girls quartet—the Harmony Belles—and a barbecue. The program gets underway at 5 and winds up at 7:30. The barbecue is at 5:30.

At 8, the Rotarians will move to Palmer auditorium at Brawley union high school for Lagueux's address, where the Holtville high school acappella choir will sing.

Price of the barbecue is \$2.50 a plate and everyone is welcome, Kipf said. Rotarians and their guests have priority on seats at the Palmer auditorium program. However, after all these have been seated the public is welcome to the remaining seats, he said. There is no charge for the auditorium program.
