Dear Margaret:

This was exceptionally good in view of the staggering blow Ole Man Winter gave us the week before - and since so much time was lost at that time, many Rotarians just couldn't give up another day, which is really necessary for members of clubs in some of the outskirt clubs. We were very happy and pleased at the fine turnout and we really had BRASS - in addition to President Lagueux, First Vice Van Churchill, four District Governors and practically all our Past District Governors from way back when we were District 33, were present.

Incidentally, Margaret, President and Mrs. Lagueux are really the most lovable couple we have had the pleasure of meeting - we really wished they could have been with us longer, but we do appreciate having them with us at all, realizing the great demands on their time.

By the way, in addition to the newspaper publicity, a transcription of President Lagueux's address was played over one of the radio stations that evening and WDTV, our one television outlet highlighted the visit in the evening news review with pictures of the arrival, etc.
