

Canada Will Never Run Out On U. S., Rotary Head Says

International President Notes Troops in Korea

Canada will never run out on the United States.

That's the pledge of Arthur Lagueux, president of Rotary International and an investment banker in Quebec.

In Pittsburgh to address today's 40th anniversary meeting of the Pittsburgh Rotary Club, the Canadian said:

"Canada and the United States are hand in hand with all problems."

5000 in Korea

Mr. Lagueux, interviewed when he called on Pittsburgh Rotary Club President George H. Dennison, added:

"Canada has 5000 troops fighting in Korea."

He declined comment on British Prime Minister Clement Attlee's visit to Washington.

But Mr. Lagueux did make one comment about Canada that few of America's allies can boast:

"We are supporting ourselves—there's no Marshall Plan."

Rotary, U.N. Compared

He then cited a parallel between Rotary International and the United Nations.

"Rotary has 450,000 members in 83 countries. And if the United Nations got along as well as we, then there would be no war."

He emphasized that there is no Rotary Club in Russia or in Iron Curtain countries.

"There they only have the 'International,'" he said, emphasizing the last syllable,
