Watertown Rotarians Planning Gala Reception for Lagueux

WATERTOWN.—The Watertown rotary club, organized in October, 1914, will entertain a president of rotary international for the first time in its history, when Arthur Lagueux of Quebec city will be the guest of honor and principal speaker at a dinner in Hotel Woodruff Thursday night.

Past president Alvie, M. Edwards, general chairman of the committee in charge of arrangements, said Wednesday that the doors of the dining room will be open at 6.10 p. m. for the seating of the 500 who are expected to attend. The dinner will be served at 6.30 p. m.

Members of rotary clubs from other New York state cities and Canadian cities will join with the host Watertown club in honoring the International president.

More than 150 reservations have been received from clubs of New York state and Canadian clubs have sent word that they will have large delegations at the meeting.

There will be nine district governors and past district governors present. They will be introduced

and will respond with brief speeches.

Frederic H. Taylor, Jr., managing director of Hotel Woodruff, and L. Murray Boyer, resident manager of the hotel, both members of the Watertown club, are arranging the dinner.

Gilbert MacFarlane, club song leader, has arranged a special musical program and Charles A. Reilly, past president, has arranged for the appearance of Miss Lucette Rouchaud, Soprano, who will be accompanied by Mrs. Orrell York.

President Clarence Me. Scott has appointed a committee consisting of Edwin D. Wilcox, Frederick F. Bugbee, Orrell A. York and John F. Shriver to welcome visiting delegations. They will be assisted by the club's fellowship committee.

President Lagueux, who will arrive at 11.10 a. m., Thursday by Colonial airline, will be met at the Watertown airport by past president Dr. Norman L. Hawkins, Harry Y. Yoder, Past district governor and past president Lloyd E. Allen, club secretary.
