Elect Canadian As Rotary Chief

Rotary International in its huge convention swung into its public service phase today.

Principal addresses today at the second plenary session, at Masonic Temple, were on community service, by W. Walter Williams of Seattle, and on service to youth, by H. Roe Bartle of Kansas City.

Yesterday's emphasis was on Rotary's international aims, plus election of a Canadian as the new international president.

He is Arthur G. Lagueux, Quebec investment banker, who succeeds Percy P. Hodgson, yarn manufacturer from Pawtucket, R. I. Re-elected treasurer was Richard E. Vernor, born in Detroit but now a Chicagoan.

Convention officials announced that 6,700 persons have registered officially. From 50 to 60 nations are represented, of the 83 in which Rotary has clubs.
