International Rotary Head In Peace Plea

More than 300 Rotarians from clubs in the Tri-Counties and Kern County gathered at the Biltmore Hotel here last night to pay honor to Arthur Lageux of Quebec, president of Rotary International.

Thomas M. Mullen, president of the Santa Barbara Rotary Club, presided. He presented various visiting club officials and introduced Warren Wilkinson of Dos Palos, district Rotary governor for this area, with more than 60 clubs under his jurisdiction. Wilkinson introduced the International president, who was the guest speaker.

Lageux declared that the present ills of the world could not be cured without development and growth of the brotherhood of man. He pointed out that men are not born with hates and jealousies and mistrust, that these unfortunate traits are acquired.

The fact that there are more than 7000 Rotary Clubs in some 32 countries in all parts of the world, with membership embracing all colors and creeds, demonstrates that the goal of brotherhood of man is not incapable of attainment, he maintained.

But he said that the movement cannot be a complete success unless it begins at the grassroots and unless it is fostered in every way possible in every local Rotary Club, no matter how small.

On behalf of the Santa Barbara group, President Mullen presented Mr. and Mrs. Lageux and Mr. and Mrs. Wilkinson with souvenirs representative of the Santa Barbara area.
