Rotarians To Open Convention Today

The first of nearly 20,000 Rotarians from 83 countries in the Americas, Europe, Asia and Africa, are expected to arrive in the resort today to begin the 42nd annual convention of the Rotary International tomorrow.

The convention will continue through Thursday. Official registration of delegates will be conducted tomorrow from 9 am. to 9 pm.

Representatives of 7,300 Rotary clubs will hear a forum discussion by four of the 284 outstanding graduate students from all parts of the world who have received one-year fellowships for

study as ambassadors of goodwill in countries other than their own.

The predominant theme of the convention will be one of internationality, for emphasis will be given to the opportunities which Rotary has in all parts of the world to assist in international goodwill.

AUSTIN TO SPEAK

Warren R. Austin, U.S. representative to the United Nations, heads the list of speakers, which also includes Arthur Lagueux, of Quebec, president of Rotary International; Utah Sen. Wallace F. Bennett; Dr. Kenneth McFarland, superintendent of schools, of Topeka, Kan., and other outstanding Rotarians from all parts of the globe.

One of the big events on the program will be a "Miss America Fashion and Talent Review" on Monday at Convention Hall.
